

## Auto Digitizing Basic Methods



### Setting Up the File

- Open a New Blank Design.
- Select Insert Artwork.
- Navigate to C: Users> Public> Public Pictures> BERNINA 9 Pictures> Artwork> jpg.
- Select A\_East\_003. Open the file.



### Instant Auto Digitizing

- Click on Instant Auto-Digitize in the Auto Digitize Toolbox.
- Stitches are automatically added to the picture.
- Objects can be edited as desired.
- Select File> Save As and name the file, Instant Auto Digitizing.



### Auto Digitizing

- Select Undo.
- Reselect the artwork.
- Click on Auto-Digitize.
- The Prepare Bitmap dialog box opens. The software located 7 colors; the white background counts as one color.
- Colors can be merged in this dialog box if needed. There is no need to merge colors for most artwork within the software.
- Click OK.
- In the next dialog box that opens, thread colors can be chosen, fills changed to outlines, or colors can be omitted.
- Click on Add thread chart colors to palette.
- Click on Select Thread Charts.
- Isacord 40 is the default thread chart, but this can be changed.
- Click OK; then OK again.
- Objects can be edited as desired.
- Select File> Save As and name the file, Auto Digitizing.



### Magic Wand

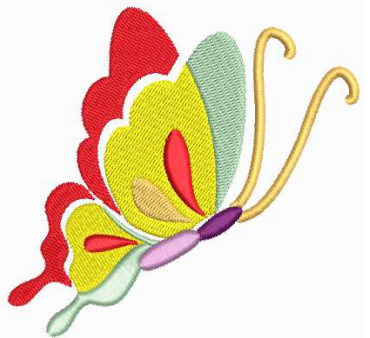
- Select Undo.
- Reselect the artwork.
- There are four different Magic Wand tools in the Digitize Toolbox. You choose your tool based on how you want the stitches to generate.
- First, the artwork must be prepared.
- Click on Prepare Bitmap. Click OK in this dialog box.
- You must decide on the stitch order with the Magic Wand tools; you will want to digitize the background objects first. The butterfly wings should be digitized before the butterfly body and the antennae should be digitized before the butterfly body.
- You can also pre-select the type of stitch prior to adding stitches so you will have less editing to do after the stitches generate.



### NOTES:



*Instant Auto-Digitize adds stitches without preparing the bitmap. With V9, the background is usually omitted.*



*Auto-Digitize adds stitches all at once and chooses the type of fill, but changes can be made in the stitches after they are generated.*

*Magic Wand tools will add stitches to the objects as you select them. You can pre-select the type of stitch to add. You determine the stitch order.*



- Select Magic Wand.
- Right click on the Step fill icon to open Object Properties.
- Select Step Fill # 5. Click Apply.
- Left click; then right click on the green areas of the artwork. A left click adds a fill; a right click adds an outline.



- Select Magic Wand Fill without Holes.
- In Object Properties, select Step Fill # 16.
- Click on the Stitch Angle tab and change the angle to 0°.
- Click Apply.
- Left click; then right click on the yellow section of the wing. This tool adds a fill and ignores the artwork objects that are within the yellow wing.



- Select Magic Wand.
- Return to the Fill Stitch tab of Object Properties.
- Change the Step Fill to # 23. Click OK to close Object Properties.



- Left click; then right click on each of the red sections.
- Select Magic Wand Centerline.
- Click on each of the antennae. This places an outline in the center of each antennae in the artwork.



- Select Magic Wand Block Digitizing.
- Select the Satin Fill in the Stitch Toolbar.
- Click on each section of the butterfly body.
- Press Esc to deactivate the tool.



- Select the antennae in Color Film.
- Click on Stemstitch Outline in the Stitch Toolbar.
- Save the file as Magic Wand.



## PhotoSnap

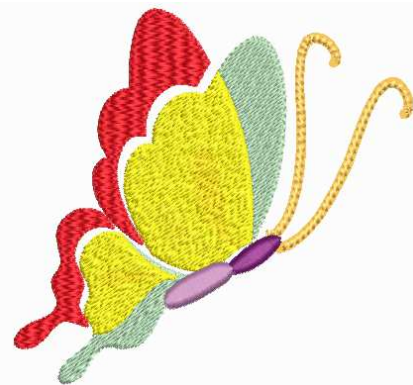
- In Color Film, select all the color chips of the stitches by selecting the first color chip, holding the Shift key, and selecting the last color chip.
- Press Delete.
- Reselect the Picture.
- Click on Adjust Bitmap.
- Place a dot by Gray under Effects.
- Move the Contrast arrow of the contrast bar to the left three clicks. Click OK.
- Click on PhotoSnap.
- Double click on the stitches to open Object Properties.
- Change the Fill angle to 45 degrees.
- Change the Resolution to Fine. Click OK.
- Hide the artwork by clicking on Show Bitmap to get an idea of how the stitches will look.
- If you need to make adjustments, you can try different settings.



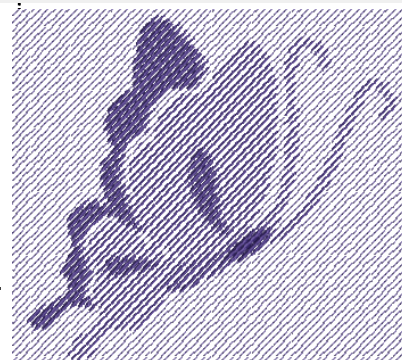
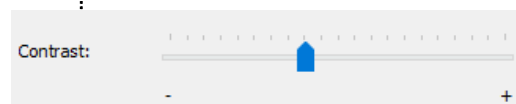
## NOTES:

*Apply keeps Object Properties open for further changes.*

*A right click adds an outline around the artwork; a left click adds a fill.*



*PhotoSnap is more successful with high contrast pictures.*



### Color PhotoStitch



- Click Undo until all the stitches are gone.
- Click on Show Bitmap to show the artwork.
- Click on Color PhotoStitch.
- Click OK in the dialog box that opens.
- Stitches are automatically added to the picture, including the background.
- Save the file as Color PhotoStitch.

**NOTES:**  
*Color PhotoStitch adds irregular stitches to the artwork.*
